The school is accepting applications for Smile Room, which provide personalized instruction for children experiencing difficulties with learning at school, and classroom assistants who provide individualized support during class. Parents/guardians who wish to apply for this service can consult with the homeroom teacher, school nurse, or vice principal by Tuesday, October 31. On Saturday, October 28, the Higashimachi's 110th Anniversary of the school will be celebrated with a music festival. The children at Higashimachi are now working hard on songs and ensembles for the festival. In music lessons, we the teachers value the students learning together and cooperating with each other to perform a song. We believe that cooperating in music lessons means listening to each other. First, they listen to their own singing voice and how their playing sounds. Then they listen to their friends' singing and playing and try to match their sound with the sounds of the whole class. Finally, they express themselves as a class or grade and feel their own presence among the sound reverberating around them. Each individual is equally important.

Through music, the students will do their best to cooperate, learn, and improve together for the upcoming Music Festival.
