



Joso Excavation Wells

Although students do not usually enter it, our school has a biotope. We make use of the biotope in life studies, science, and environmental education to observe the biotope's ecology. At this time of year, countless tadpoles inhabit the biotope, and we can see killifish and dragonfly larvae too. There is one more important thing in the biotope – the *Kazusabori* well. *Kazusabori* is a traditional method of digging wells by hand from the Kazusa region of Chiba Prefecture. This method uses the elastic qualities of bamboo and is powered by humans. The large waterwheel-like wheel used for digging the well still remains today. This well was dug in 2010 with the cooperation of the local community, PTA, children, and teachers. The other day, I watched a DVD that documented the digging of the well. I was moved to learn that so many people worked so hard to complete the well. As a matter of fact, the well at one point could no longer draw any water due to deterioration of the well. However, with the cooperation of the Minato City Board of Education, repairs were made and water could be drawn from the well again. This well water is not for drinking, but it is used for watering the plants in the biotope as well as for disaster emergencies.

On a final note: Sports Day is scheduled for May 18. Like last year, the event will be divided into morning and afternoon sessions. This year, in order to make it even easier to view the events, the classrooms on the second floor will be available as viewing spaces with the help of the PTA. We appreciate your cooperation.

About the ESC Program

Currently, 14 students from 7 countries are studying in the ESC (English Support Course). ESC students study in separate classrooms with an EST (English Support Teacher) during math and kokugo time. For other subjects, ESC students study together in the classroom with their classmates while the EST interprets the teacher's instructions.

Students learn math according to the Japanese curriculum using translated textbooks. During *kokugo* time, students study English (and Japanese for Grades 1 and 2). In English classes, students learn language skills similar to those studied in *kokugo* in order to maintain English proficiency and appropriate for their grade. In Japanese classes, students learn vocabulary and expressions necessary for school and daily life.

Our school is blessed with an environment of international understanding that fosters a mindset and attitude necessary to thrive in the global society of the future. We encourage all students to be proud of themselves and their own cultures as well as understand, accept, and recognize other cultures.
