# An Opportunity to Think About Human Rights

Principal Tetsuro Kawahara We were very pleased to welcome so many visitors to our art exhibition and to have you enjoy the students' wonderful artwork. The children also discovered many good points in their friends' and other grades' works.

December 10 is Human Rights Day, and in Japan the week leading up to this day is observed as Human Rights Week. At Higashimachi Elementary, we will hold our own Human Rights Week from December 3–10, providing opportunities for students to reflect on and deepen their understanding of human

rights.

Although "human rights" can be a difficult concept, the essential idea is to value both ourselves and others. By thinking about their own strengths, recognizing the good qualities of friends, and noticing differences among people, children begin to appreciate each person's individuality. We hope they will grow in their ability to recognize and celebrate these differences.

Listening to classmates, acknowledging their ideas in lessons, and recognizing the strengths in others' work—as seen in the art exhibition—are all important foundations for developing a

sense of human rights.

Our school will continue to create opportunities for students to learn about human rights issues, including bullying, so they can understand the importance of both themselves and others, eliminate discriminatory attitudes, and act with respect and empathy. We also encourage families to take this opportunity to talk with your children about human rights and bullying.

The 112<sup>th</sup> student who gave a cheerful, energetic greeting was introduced and recognized during the ceremony—an initiative reflecting the committee's wish to encourage even more students to greet one another.
