It is the last month of the first term. Thank you to all of 956 parents, guardians, and community members who visited us during our open school last month on the 15th (Fri) and 16th (Sat).

The following is a story that takes place in a school I worked at previously. The 20-minute recess had ended. The chime had rung, but there were 5 5th-grade boys who were still tossing their ball around and bumping into each other while heading to class. Seeing this, Teacher A (male) said, "How long are you gonna keep playing around? Get to class now." 4 of the 5 boys heard this and headed for the classroom, but Boy B acted like he did not hear. Teacher A then spoke more strictly to Boy B, who in turn threw the ball high up into the air and chased after it towards the corner of the school yard.

At that point, Teacher C (male) happened to walk by. Then, seeing Teacher C, Boy B put the ball under his harm and ran back to the classroom as if nothing had happened.

Boy B actually stood out as a student who was often told by teachers how to behave. Also, teacher A is strict to many students; but Teacher C, every time he sees Boy B, says nice things like "You did the morning assembly's greeting pretty well," or "You tried really hard in the club activities." Surely Boy B wanted to keep that same image in front of Teacher C.

There are students who act nicely when we are strict, but there are also students who do the exact opposite when we are only strict to them. When students get in trouble, we often hear "They won't do that at home if we're strict with them." Whether parents are strict at home or not, troubled behavior can still occur. Therefore, methods that encourage children are important. Also, instead of switching roles between "strict" and "nice," it is important to achieve a balance when interacting with children.
