To the Next Stage Together

Last month, 22 graduate students left Higashimachi Elementary School. There were only four students when they attended their entrance ceremony. Six years later, in the spring sun, we welcomed 92 cute and energetic 1st graders, and the 2016-17 school year began with 412 students, 12 classes (three in grade 1, two each in grades 2-5). Congratulations to all on starting a new school year.

This year, taking advantage of all the good things in Higashimachi, we must focus our energy on re-evaluating our approach and working together to help further our school's development. The major points we have reviewed are as follows:

<u>Name Tags</u>: To ensure the students' safety throughout the school, all students will wear name tags.

<u>Uniform Timetable</u>: Friday and Saturday's timetables are revised so that the entire week's timetable is uniform.

<u>Home Visits</u>: To observe our students' areas, home visits will be conducted during the summer holidays.

New Building (Annex): The new building will be used for 3 – 6 grade small math class and ESC's language and math class. The Hall will also be moved, and the building will be called the Annex.

Revising the School Trip: This year, the school-wide trip will be done in pairs (Gr. 1-2, 3-4, 5-6).

<u>Family Activities</u>: We now have 14 families. For different activities, they will be sub-divided into groups A and B.

<u>Japanese Culture</u>: Grades 1 and 2 will do karuta, origamai, and animal shōgi. In addition to those activities, grade 3 will do *hyakunin isshu*, and grades 4-6 will do tea ceremony, incense, Japanese taiko, and shōgi. At the end of the year, as part of orientation, the 3rd graders will participate once in tea ceremony, incense, Japanese taiko, and shōai.

<u>Participation in Events</u>: Gr. 1, 2, and 6 will participate in the entrance ceremony, 5 and 6 in the graduation ceremony and the committees.

<u>Special Assistance</u>: This year throughout Minato city, special assistance classes will be held. After preparation, the classes are expected to start in May.

<u>School Lunch</u>: In addition to the increase of student lunches, as of March, 42 specialty lunches were prepared. The number is expected to increase and preparation has become difficult. We hope to speak further about this with parents and guardians.

There are many changes taking place, but with the cooperation and support parents, guardians, and community members, the faculty members will work together to conduct classes and school activities to our best abilities. We appreciate everyone's cooperation this academic year.
