At Higashimachi, "Family Activities" (Family Katsudo) are held as a way for different grades to interact with each other. All classes from Grade 1 to Grade 6 are divided into groups called "families," and do play activities as well as clean together under the leadership of the Grade 6 members in the family. However, due to COVID-19, grades have had to remain separated and family activities were suspended.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 is still spreading. However, by reducing the amount of people participating in the activities and avoiding crowding, we decided to pair up grades (1 and 6, 2 and 4, 3 and 5) to continue family activities and give the students an opportunity to interact with each other.

In previous years, Higashimachi held its Higashimachi Festival around the end of June. The festival was an event where each class set up stalls where students can visit and play games. On the day of the festival, students in Grades 3 and above would divide into those working the stalls and those visiting other stalls and then switch, while Grades 1 and 2 would have the whole time to visit as many shops as possible. However, last year, as a measure to prevent infection, the event was cancelled, and although we considered having the festival on different days for different grades, it was decided that holding a festival while other grades were having class would be difficult.

This year, on the days we had scheduled for the Higashimachi Festival we have decided to have "Long Family Asobi," where each family will enjoy playing games planned by Grade 6 students. We hope the students will have plenty of time to enjoy interacting with other grades.

## Art Class: A Time to Discover One's Qualities and Possibilities

In art class, students are introduced to tools and materials appropriate to their development and maturity. When familiarizing themselves with them, the students engage their senses to look, touch, smell, and even hear, immersing themselves in the colors and shapes. From their senses they are able to broaden their ideas and discover what feels good to them. For example, Grade 6 in previous years made a tree house they would like to live in, and many students found themselves thinking about the ideal forest for their tree house after smelling and feeling the wood they were using. By cutting clean through the rafters with a saw, or making curves in the plywood with an electric fretsaw, many students thought about how to utilize their tools and the qualities of the wood.

In that way, to actualize the colors, shapes, and images in their imagination, students choose the appropriate materials and through trial and error discover new ways of thinking and expression as well as find inspiration from friends and others around them. That is why in arts and crafts class, it is important for students to discover their qualities and potential by allowing them to interact with an abundance of materials and tools. Also, by observing the students and listening to what they say, we want to help each student understand themselves.

## **Highlights from the P.E. Performances**






Grade 1 will give an energetic dance to Hige Dandism's "Shukumei." Each column will do different dances and there are even formation changes. Please cheer them on!
