The revised course of studies mentions the importance of career lessons, and since 2020 all elementary, junior, and senior high schools have been developing a curriculum called "Career Passport" ($\# \# J T \cdot N \rtimes \# - b$). The career passport contains content from lessons and activities collected throughout each students' primary and secondary education. The goal of Career Passport is to help students develop a sense of what career they would want to choose over 12 years from elementary to senior high. Students will use their own ideas and review what they learned while observing their progress over 12 years. Students will not only record their thoughts and feelings about lessons and school events at school but will also include things they learned in their communities and at home. From the contents in the individual files, we believe that teachers and family members will be able to play an interactive part in helping children understand themselves and be a big part in their development.
