Hydrangeas are blooming brightly under the rainy sky. Even if you cannot go to any tourist spots where hydrangeas are blooming, you can sometimes see them majestically blooming in the hedgerows by the sidewalks, reminding us of the season. At the recent school assembly, we talked about how rainfall during this rainy season is essential for the growth of crops and how the children should spend rainy days.

Now that the COVID pandemic has passed, educational activities at the school are back to normal; and from June 19 to 21, the 6th graders went on their Hakone trip. Although it was during the rainy season, the weather was cool, and we were able to complete the entire trip comfortably and safely. Especially on the second day, we walked along the stone steps of the old Tokaido Highway. The children experienced the paths that people actually walked on in the Edo Period, and they also learned about the old highway by reading the explanatory signs along the way.

The students were divided into two main groups: the *seikatsu* group while staying in the facility and the *kodo* group while going out. Both groups observed the "5-minute" rule as they carried out their duties. I was impressed by the efforts of the group leaders for organizing their groups. Everyone fulfilled their roles, and the teachers felt they could depend on the children during the three days.

Thank you very much for your attendance at the recent open school. Instead of the specified visiting dates and times that were used in the past, parents and other visitors were able to visit the school at their convenience and observe the subjects they wanted to see throughout the two days.
