Since the summer break began, we have been working on replacing the air conditioners and installing watertight slabs in the gym in case the Furukawa River floods. Some of the work may extend into September, but we will continue to do so with the safety of the children as our top priority.

The weather was fine, and the children cooperated with each other in various situations and showed responsible behavior in their *seikatsu* and *kodo* groups. I believe that this experience will be useful for them in the future as upper graders.
